

# OPHTHALMO CHIRURGIE

## Authors' Notes 2025

### General

A prerequisite for submitting a manuscript is that the work has not yet been published or submitted elsewhere for publication. In addition, all co-authors as well as the institution where the work originated must agree - implicitly or explicitly - to the publication.

### Permissions

When using parts of the text, illustrations and tables from other publications, the author must obtain permission from the copyright holder (usually the original publisher) for use in both the printed and electronic/online versions of the journal.

### Submission

Please send your text by e-mail to the respective editorial office (see address below). The text should be saved as a Word document. After review by the editorial office as well as the editorial board and, if applicable, the scientific advisory board, a decision will be made as to whether the manuscript can be published.

### Length

- A contribution should comprise at least 3-4 printed pages.
- 1 printed page of text (Word file) = approx. 5800 characters including blank spaces, with two pictures/2 subheadings approx. 3800 characters.
- 1 printed page = 6 illustrations (8.6 x 5.6 cm) with legends.

### Text

- The text should not be written at a specialist level, but in such a way that even an ophthalmologist who is not familiar with the subject can understand it.
- Nested sentences and noun-laden verbs should be avoided.
- The text should be broken up with as many meaningful subheadings as possible (concise key sentences).
- The text should be saved as a Word file.
- The use of AI in the creation of the text must be indicated and the editors reserve the right not to publish AI-assisted texts.

### Summary

At the beginning of each contribution there is a concise summary of the essential content "in 5 sentences". Summaries are not an introduction, but a concise overview of the entire content.

## **Illustrations**

The text should be illustrated in detail and clearly. Please send printable, high-resolution illustrations as separate image files (jpg, tiff or eps), not embedded in the Word document, at least 300dpi.

*... with illustration legends!*

The captions should not only consist of a keyword, but should be detailed and describe to the viewer what he/she sees in detail and what he/she should pay special attention to. Each picture should have its own caption.

## **Literature**

- As short as possible, maximum 20 references
- Abbreviations of journal titles according to the guidelines of the Index Medicus.
